It's the season where we transition from the hot summer to feel the arrival of autumn. When we think of autumn, we think of beautiful foliage, bountiful harvests, and stunning sunsets. It's a season when the landscapes of our wide district warmly welcome us. This is also the season of the "Wide District Education Festival," a wonderful opportunity to enjoy diverse cultures, arts, and interactions. The Wide District Education Festival not only strengthens the bonds within our community but also creates opportunities for new discoveries and friendships. Now, speaking of November events, "Shichi-Go-**San**" also comes to mind. While it's commonly said to take place on November 15th, it's not necessarily restricted to that day.

The schedule varies based on shrines, temples, and local customs. It's often celebrated when boys turn 3 and 5, and girls turn 3 and 7. In the past, with high child mortality rates, children were treated as "gods' children" until the age of 7. At ages 3, 5, and 7, celebrations were held to express gratitude for growth, and it seems that at age 7, a child finally became a proper person. For boys and girls at 3 years old, there's the "Hair Placement Ceremony," for 5-year-old boys, the "Hakama Wearing Ceremony," and for 7-year-old girls, the "*Obi* Unfastening Ceremony." Odd-numbered ages are chosen because it's said that at 3 they understand words at 5 wisdom emerges, and at 7 milk teeth are replaced. 'Chitose Ame", a long red-and-white stick candy, is a traditional Japanese sweet used for celebratory occasions and

special events. The term "Chitose" literally means "thousand vears" and symbolizes longevity and good fortune. While *Shichi-Go-San* is a celebration of children's growth,

it's also important to share feelings of gratitude with parents and grandparents. Director Hosokawa.

Editorial Note What is "Koharu-Biyori"?

The time around November is called "koharu", and the days from late autumn to early winter that are warm and calm like spring are called koharu-biyori. The mild and clear sky in the beginning of winter is called "koharu-zora", the warm and calm sea in early winter is called "koharu-nagi", and sunbathing in koharu-bivori is called "koharu-hinata". There is a haiku by Masaoka Shiki that says "koharu-hinata ni neko mo nesoberi keri", which means "a cat also lies down in the koharu-hinata". I wonder if you would write a haiku while thinking about such things on a *koharu-bivori* day.
