Let's Throw Beans to Drive Away Evil Spirits!

Happy New Year to everyone in Hiro area. We are delighted to usher in the New Year. Our staff will work hard to make this year a vibrant and lively place for everyone, so please continue to support us. Now, when it comes to February, we think of

Setsubun. Setsubun is a day that marks the division between seasons and falls on the day before the beginning of spring.

During *Setsubun*, we drive away evil spirits and invite good fortune by throwing beans. This tradition has its roots in ancient China, known as "tsuina," where on New Year's Eve, onmyoji

(yin-yang masters) performed a ritual to dispel misfortune and calamities. Around the Muromachi period, the custom evolved to drive away demons using beans as we do now. It has long been believed that spirits dwell in the "five grains" (rice, barley,

barnyard millet, millet, & soybeans), and the largest size soybean was considered the most effective in warding off demons.

Additionally, the alternate kanji for "mame" that means "to destroy demons" is written as "魔滅(*ma-me*)" in Japanese.

In English, it can be translated as "demon extermination" or 'demon slaying' in "mamemaki" (bean-throwing) was associated with "defeating demons," adding another layer of meaning. Not using raw beans is because if bean sprouts after being left behind, it is considered unlucky as it is believed that "evil energy sprouts." The term "oni" (demon) during Setsubun refers not to literal demons but to "evil energy, calamities, and illnesses." The chant "Oni wa soto, fuku wa uchi" (Demons out, fortune in) is done in that order to "drive out demons before inviting in fortune."

However, at *Ohara* Shrine in *Fukuchiyama* City, Kyoto Prefecture, the chant is reversed to "Oni wa uchi, fuku wa soto," indicating the intention to "invite the demon into the shrine, change its heart, and then

send it out as fortune." Let's embrace the cold and welcome an energetic and enjoyable Setsubun. Why not participate in community activities in *Hiro* Town, sharing smiles and vitality? Have a great *Setsubun*! Director, Hosokawa



Editorial Note~Eeast-NorthEast, slightly East~

Around the time of *Setsubun*, commercials begin airing that promote eating a special kind of sushi roll called "*Ehōmaki*" while facing a specific direction for good fortune. In 2024, the auspicious direction is "East-NorthEast, slightly **East**." The direction for *Ehō* (auspicious direction) becomes "East-NorthEast" when the last digit of A.D. is "4 or 9."

and rolled in seaweed (nori) The concept of $Eh\bar{o}$ is rooted in the belief that there is a deity called *Toshitokujin* (the god symbolizing age) who governs the blessings and virtues of the year, and $Eh\bar{o}$ represents the direction where this deity resides. Any direction where *Toshitokujin* resides is considered highly auspicious. This direction changes every year and is limited to four patterns: "East NorthEast," "West SouthWest" "South SouthEast," and "North NorthWest." These patterns are determined by the combination of the "10 Japanese Calendar Signs," which categorize ten-day cycles and assign names to each day within that cycle.
