

## Plum Blossom Viewing (Umehanami)

Happy New Year to all members of the community! As the cold weather becomes more intense, I hope this message finds you well. As we move forward, we will continue to recognize the importance of our center's role as a place where community members can gather, learn together, and support one another. We are committed to carrying out our daily activities with this in \_ mind. Now, with February comes the plum blossom, and

today **b** I'd like to take a deeper look at the tradition of "ume-mi," or plum viewing. In Japan during the **Weian** period, the culture of flower appreciation was thriving, and particularly, cherry and plum blossoms were seen as symbols of flowers. The imperial court would even hold 'plum blossom banquets" and "plum blossom viewing ceremonies." By the Edo period, this tradition spread among the common people, and it became a popular practice to enjoy the blooming plum blossoms. The term "ume-mi" (plum blossom viewing) started to be used at this time. Plum blossoms bloom earlier than cherry blossoms, with flowers that are relatively modest in color, ranging from white to red. While cherry blossoms often bloom all at once in full splendor, plum blossoms open gradually, even in large numbers, giving them a quieter, more serene appearance. For this reason, *ume-mi* tends to be a calm and peaceful activity. The plum blossom's distinctive fragrance is another key feature. The scent of plum blossoms can be stronger

than that of cherry blossoms, adding to their unique charm. As for *Setsubun*, which marks the day before the start of spring, it holds special significance because plum blossoms are a symbol of early spring. It's common for both plum viewing and **Setsubun** to take place around the same time.

The blooming of the plum blossoms signals the end of winter and the approach of the warm spring days, and with Setsubun's tradition of driving away evil spirits, it's seen as a way to prepare for the new spring. Though the weather is cold, I sincerely wish for your good health and happiness.
